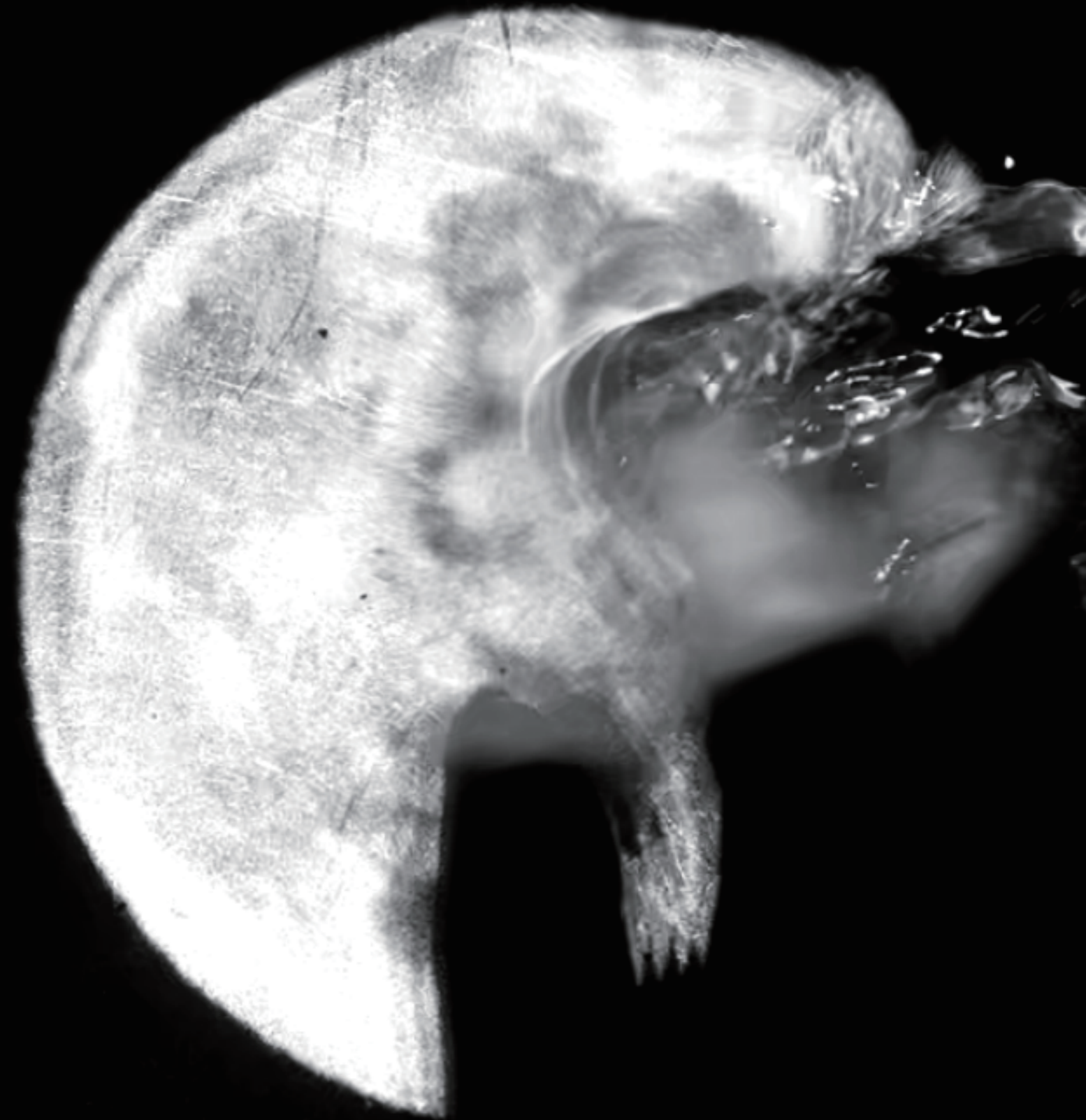


Material Experiment of Shadow

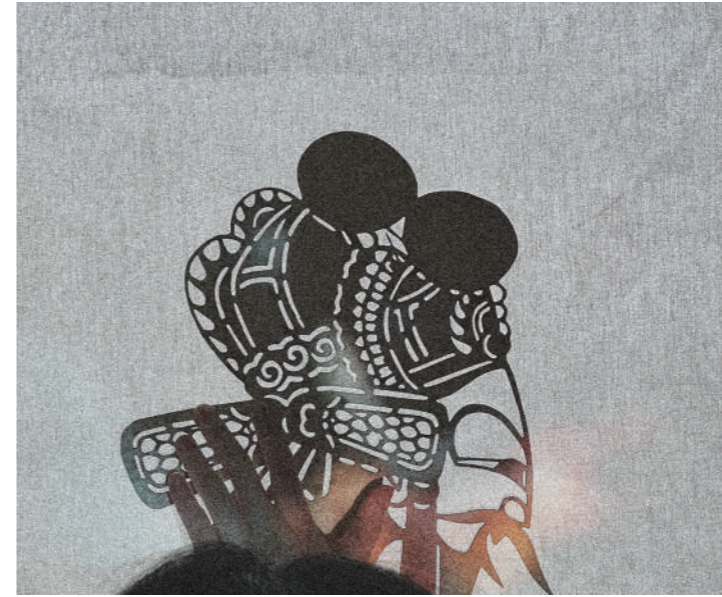
In Unit 1, I explored how different materials' transparency affects shadows. Testing paper, fabric, and plastic, I found that thickness and texture changed shadow depth and created layered, blurred effects. These deceptive shadows can blur reality, prompting viewers to question what they see. This experiment highlighted how material choices shape visual expression and inspired new ideas for my work.

Unit 2 - Reflection



In Unit 2, I tried displaying shadow puppetry next to a window so that the performance could be seen from the outside. This approach broke traditional viewing boundaries, extending the indoor experience to the outdoors. With this method, shadow puppetry attracted more viewers.

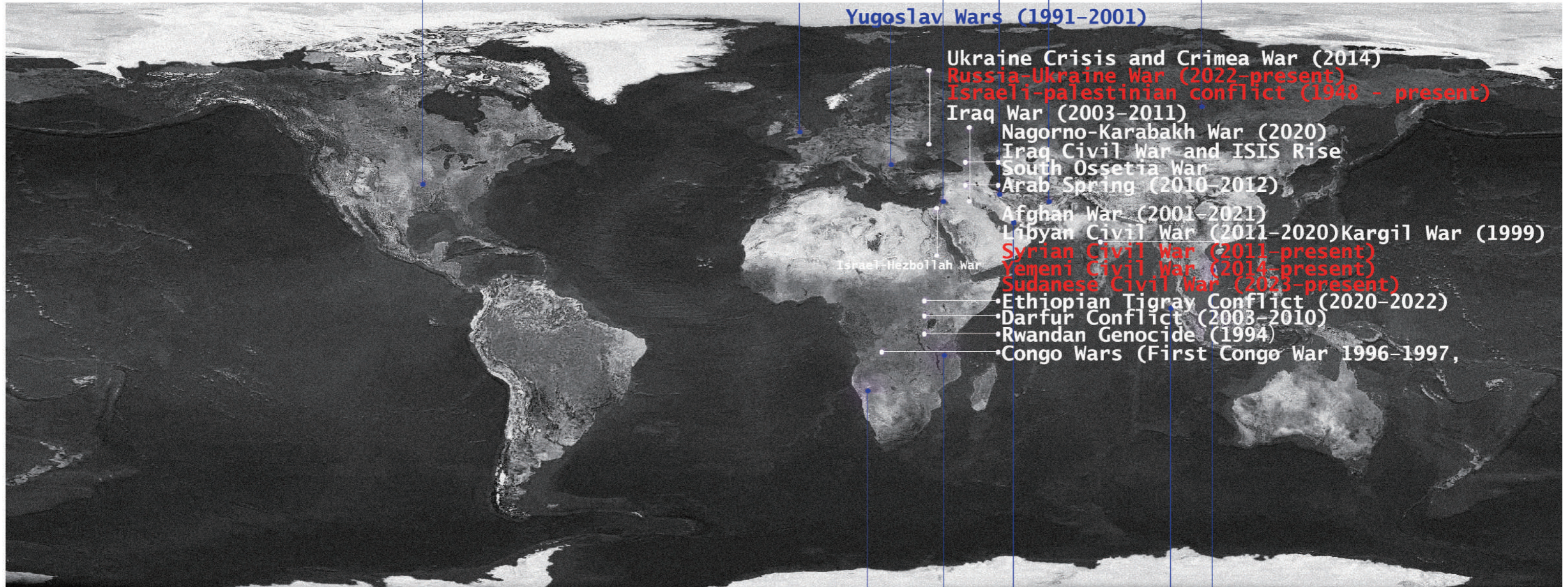


In terms of video of unit 2, I should consider how to protect and tell the story as anonymously as possible, rather than spreading it again through this kind of footage of their injuries.

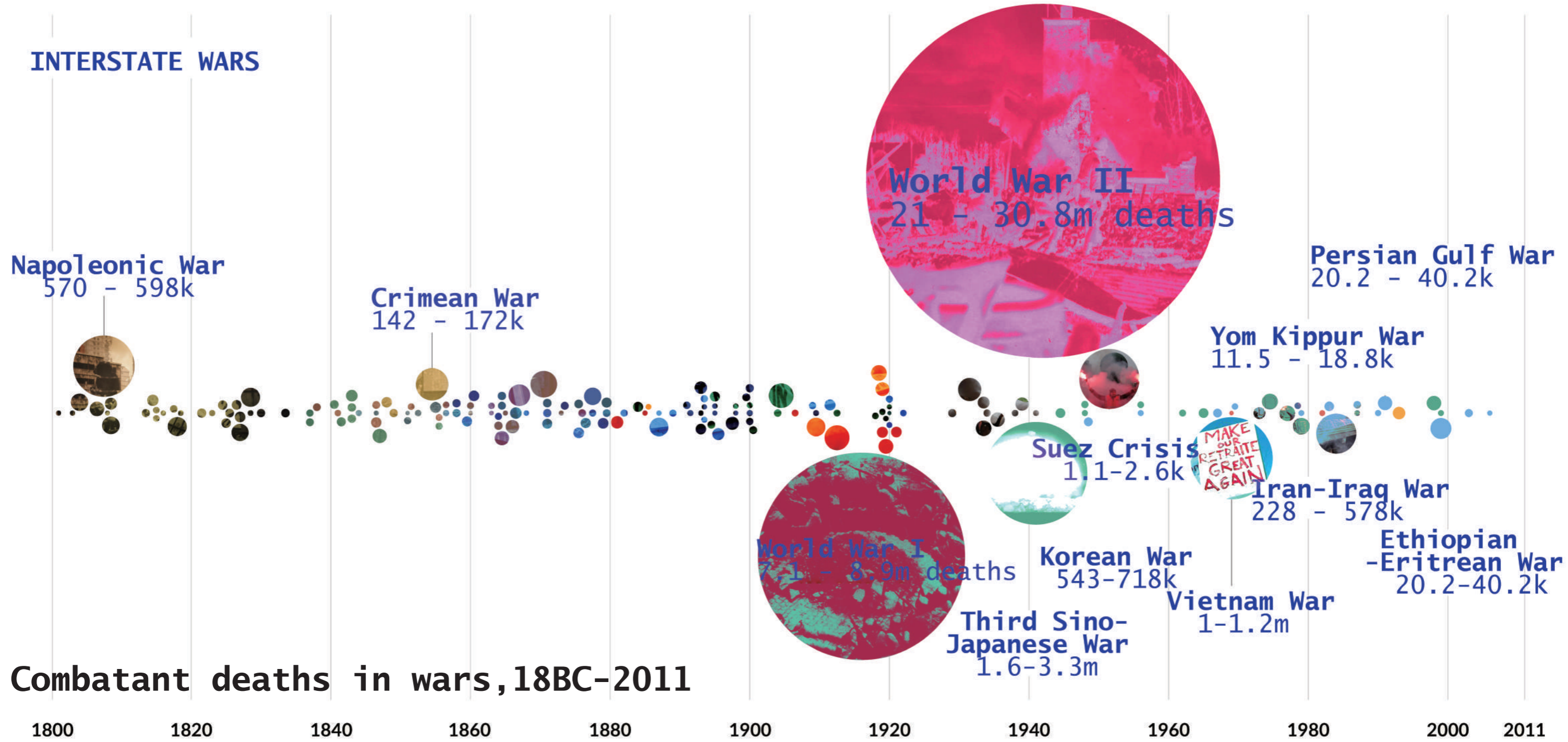

01 - Ongoing Syrian Civil War

The Syrian Civil War, now in its 12th year, continues with ongoing clashes, particularly in Idlib Province and northern Syria.



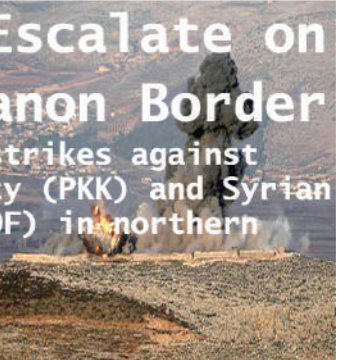
12 - Protests and Crackdowns in Iran

Economic issues and ongoing crackdowns on opposition protests caused renewed unrest in Iran.



07 - Tensions Escalate on the Israel-Lebanon Border

Turkey continued airstrikes against Kurdish Workers' Party (PKK) and Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) in northern Syria and Iraq.



09 - Israel-Hamas Conflict Escalates

In September 2023, violence between Israel and Hamas escalated once again. Militants in Gaza launched rockets at Israel, prompting Israeli airstrikes on Gaza, resulting in significant civilian casualties.



03 - Tensions Escalate on the Israel-Lebanon Border

Tensions between Israel and Hezbollah in Lebanon escalated in April, with Israel conducting airstrikes in southern Lebanon, while Hezbollah engaged in provocations along the border.



10 - Partial Ceasefire in Yemen

The conflict in Yemen persisted throughout most of 2023, but with the thawing of Saudi-Iranian relations, a partial ceasefire was achieved.

The second cast is based on the prisoner in the cave metaphor and tells the story of the still imprisoned but in a different state than the first prisoner. The materials used in this statue are cleaner, but still maintain a rough, raw texture. This contrast reflects the relatively undamaged state of the prisoner, but the roughness of the material symbolizes his continued captivity and struggle.
